## **Planning the Body of Your Paper**

Between your introduction and your conclusion comes the body of your essay. The body of your essay is where you organize your information and ideas into a coherent argument.

Here are some pointers for planning the body of your paper.

- 1. Make claims that advance your argument
  A claim is a statement of fact or opinion. Claims are the basis of any argument,
  and presenting an argument is the main task of the body of your paper.
- 2. Support your claims with evidence Evidence is information from reliable sources that helps you form a conclusion or make a judgment.
- 3. Cite the sources of your evidence properly
  Proper citation allows the reader to find the original source of your
  information and gives credit where credit is due. Not citing your sources
  properly is called *plagiarism*, and is a serious academic offense.
